Tasks and work to keep you busy at home!

- Reading. Note in your reading record and/or in your journal
- Writing – Keep a daily diary of what you have done that day. This can be more informal for younger children. Pictures are also welcomed!
- Maths- Try to do a page/side daily in your mental maths book (Schofield & Sims)
- Spelling- Practise and learn spellings in your home spelling books Years 1 & 2 (there are additional spellings at the back of the books)
- Phonics- Try to do a page each day in your phonics books. (Schofield & Sims)
- Phonics for Reception and Year 1- the next RWI sets have been photocopied for your child to work through indicated with a paper clip. You **do not** need do these all in one go.
- Lexia- Children will still have access to this at home.
- Handwriting- Try to do a page a day (also good for spellings/comprehension)
- Easter Project- The Olympics (See inside your project book)
