Write a little poem about summer.

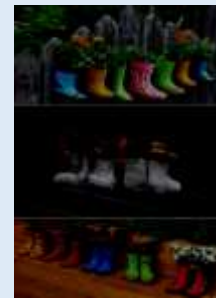
Think of the sun shining, the flowers blooming, the birds singing and the grass growing. Use your senses too!

### Wild GARDENING

### COOKERY CORNER

#### Mrs Hedley's Oat flake Cookies

- 1 Melt 100g margarine or butter
- 2 Add 1 tablespoon of syrup
- 3 Add 100g of Self-raising flour  
75g sugar  
50g porridge oats
- 4 Add ½ teaspoon of salt and bicarbonate of soda
- 5 Put spoonfuls onto a baking tray and bake at Gas mark 4/  
160deg.celcius (fan).  
Wait until cooled before eating.☺

### SUPER SCIENCE

Learn how flowers or a stick of celery soak up water, by placing one or two cut flowers or celery sticks into a container holding water with food colouring added to it. Blue or red colours show up best.

It also works well with bought cut flowers such as white carnations!

Watch and see what colours your flowers or celery become. See where the water travels up their stems.

### HISTORY
