Simple Apple Feeder



ART & CRAFT



Use your scissors to cut along the central line of a leaf from stem to tip.
Then stick your half-leaf down in your nature journal or on your sheet of paper.
Can you complete the other half?
Take your time, and look very carefully at the shape of your leaf. See if you can follow the lines and bumps exactly on your half.
You might like to use a pencil, so you can rub out any wobbles!

SUPER SCIENCE

Rainbow in a Glass

We know you're making rainbows. How about one in a glass? www.sciencefun.org/kidszone/experiments/rainbow-in-a-glass/

You need

Water A mug 5 separate cups A tablespoon A clear glass A dropper or pipette Skittles sweets

Method

1. Separate the Skittles into the cups in these amounts: 2 red, 4 orange, 6 yellow, 8 green and 10 purple.
- 2 Heat a mug of water in a microwave for one minute and a half (or long enough that the water is hot, but not boiling). Be careful removing the water from the microwave- it's hot!
- 3 Measure and pour 2 tablespoons of hot water into each cup, on top of the Skittles.
- 4 Stir each cup carefully so no water splashes out. The cups need to be cool for the next part of the experiment, so leave them somewhere where they won't get knocked over. Stir them every ten minutes or so until the Skittles are dissolved and the water is room temperature.
- 5 Using a dropper, add the coloured water from the five cups to the clear glass. Start with purple, then add green, then yellow, orange and red last. Go slowly here - we don't want the colours to mix.
- 6 Congratulations, you have made a rainbow!

Flower Petal Sun Catcher



- Cut the centre of a paper plate.
- Cut out a circle of sticky back plastic that is slightly bigger than the hole in the paper plate.
- Stick the sticky back plastic to the hole at the bottom of the plate (sticky side up)
- Add petals, leaves or grass.
- Cut out the second circle of sticky back plastic and stick in on top of your design.
- To hang the sun catcher up use a hole punch to make a hole at the top of the plate and add string/pipe cleaner.
